

## Campbell House (Criteria for Admission)

### Population:

1. Resident must be male age 13-17.
2. Resident must have a primary diagnosis of mental illness. Dual diagnosis and Multiple Disabilities will be reviewed on a case by case basis to determine capability and whether the company is competent to provide the compatibility and the level of care required to give the client the best possible quality of life. Residents with mental health illnesses who accept admission into the program, will receive services from a professional resource team.
3. Resident is not known to have tuberculosis in a communicable form.
4. Resident does not have a history (within 2 years) of creating unsafe conditions such as setting fires.
5. Resident's active Behavior Management Plan does not require the use of procedures which would conflict with Campbell House Human Rights Plan: seclusion, intrusive aversive therapy, or mechanical restraints or a need for restrictive behavior interventions.
6. Completed application for services to include residents presenting problem, history of previous interventions and treatment, prior psychiatric data, medical history, educational history and previous criminal history.
7. Intake interview with program director, prospective resident, and referral source.
8. Residents willingness to participate in all phases of treatment planning.

Exclusion Criteria:

1. Resident has tuberculosis in a communicable form.
2. Resident is in need of extensive mental care procedures.
3. Resident requires intrusive therapies, seclusions, or mechanical restraints.
4. Resident has a history (within 2 years) of creating unsafe conditions such as fire setting, untreated psychosis, self mutilating tendencies, sex offenses
5. Resident's needs are unavailable by Campbell House.
6. Resident requires a wheelchair for mobility.
7. Resident does not have a primary diagnosis of mental illness.
8. If a resident's status changes and he/she no longer needs nor meets the criteria described in the above statements, the resident may be discharged from the program.
9. A Licensed Clinical Therapist will be available to support the clinical needs of the resident. The optimal level of care will be presented, in addition to recommendations for admission or exclusion to the program.
